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The first Editorial Board was initiated by the Society of American Bacteriologists, currently known as American Society for Microbiology. The board consisted of David H. Bergey (Chairman), Francis C. Harrison, Robert S. Breed, Bernard W. Hammer and Frank M. Huntoon, and brought the first edition of the Manual into print in 1923. Following the success of the first edition, the second and third editions were then published in 1925 and 1930. In 1936, the Bergey's Manual Trust was formed to use the royalty income provided from sale of the Manual to pay the costs of preparing, editing and publishing revisions and successive editions of the Manual as well as providing for research that may be necessary or desirable in such activities.

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
