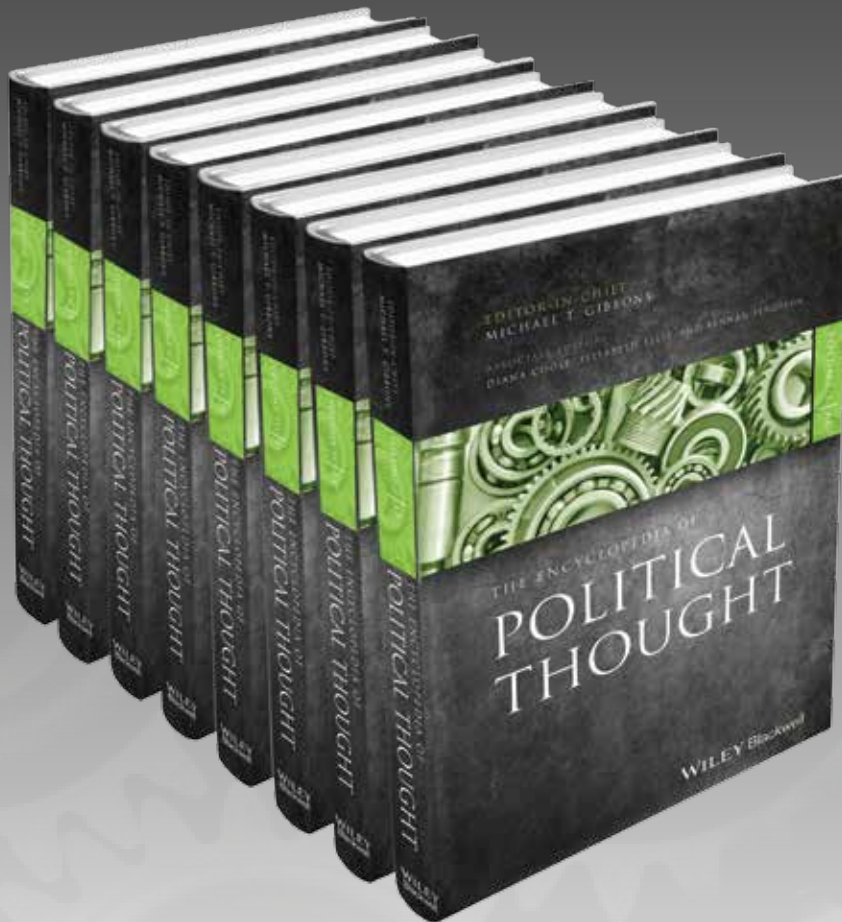

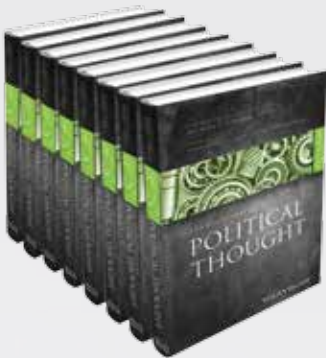

EDITOR-IN-CHIEF

Michael T. Gibbons is Associate Professor of Government and International Affairs at the University of South Florida. He received his doctorate degree from the University of Massachusetts in 1983 with foci on political theory and political economy. He has taught at Siena College and Boston University, as well as at Masaryk University in the Czech Republic as part of the Fulbright Program. He is the author of various articles, chapters, and reviews on contemporary political theory and American political thought. He is co-editor of *The Federalists, the Antifederalists, and the American Political Tradition* (with Wilson Carey McWilliams, 1992) and editor of *Interpreting Politics* (1987).

ASSOCIATE EDITORS

Diana Coole is Professor of Political and Social Theory at Birkbeck, University of London. Her books include *New Materialisms: Ontology, Agency, and Politics* (edited with Samantha Frost, 2010), *Merleau-Ponty and Modern Politics after Anti-Humanism* (2007), and *Negativity and Politics: Dionysus and Dialectics from Kant to Poststructuralism* (2000). Her research interests include phenomenology, genealogy, and critical theory, especially as these are applied to gender, political economy, demography, and the body. She is currently completing a study on the population question funded by a three-year Leverhulme Fellowship.

Elisabeth Ellis is Associate Professor of Philosophy at the University of Otago. She is the author of *Provisional Politics: Kantian Arguments in Policy Context* (2008) and *Kant's Politics: Provisional Theory for an Uncertain World* (2005); she has also edited a volume of essays, *Kant's Political Theory: Interpretations and Applications* (2012). Ellis's current book project, *Extinction and Democracy*, asks whether democratic practices and species conservation are compatible. Other recent projects include a reception history of Hobbes's political thought and an assessment of the challenges environmental policy poses for democratic theory. She is currently serving as co-president of the Association for Political Theory.

Kennan Ferguson teaches political theory at the University of Wisconsin, Milwaukee. He is author of *All in the Family: On Community and Incommensurability* (2012), *William James: Politics in the Pluriverse* (2007), and *The Politics of Judgment* (1999). He also chairs the Foundations of Political Theory section of the American Political Science Association and co-edits, with Morton Schoolman, the Rowman and Littlefield series *Modernity and Political Thought*.

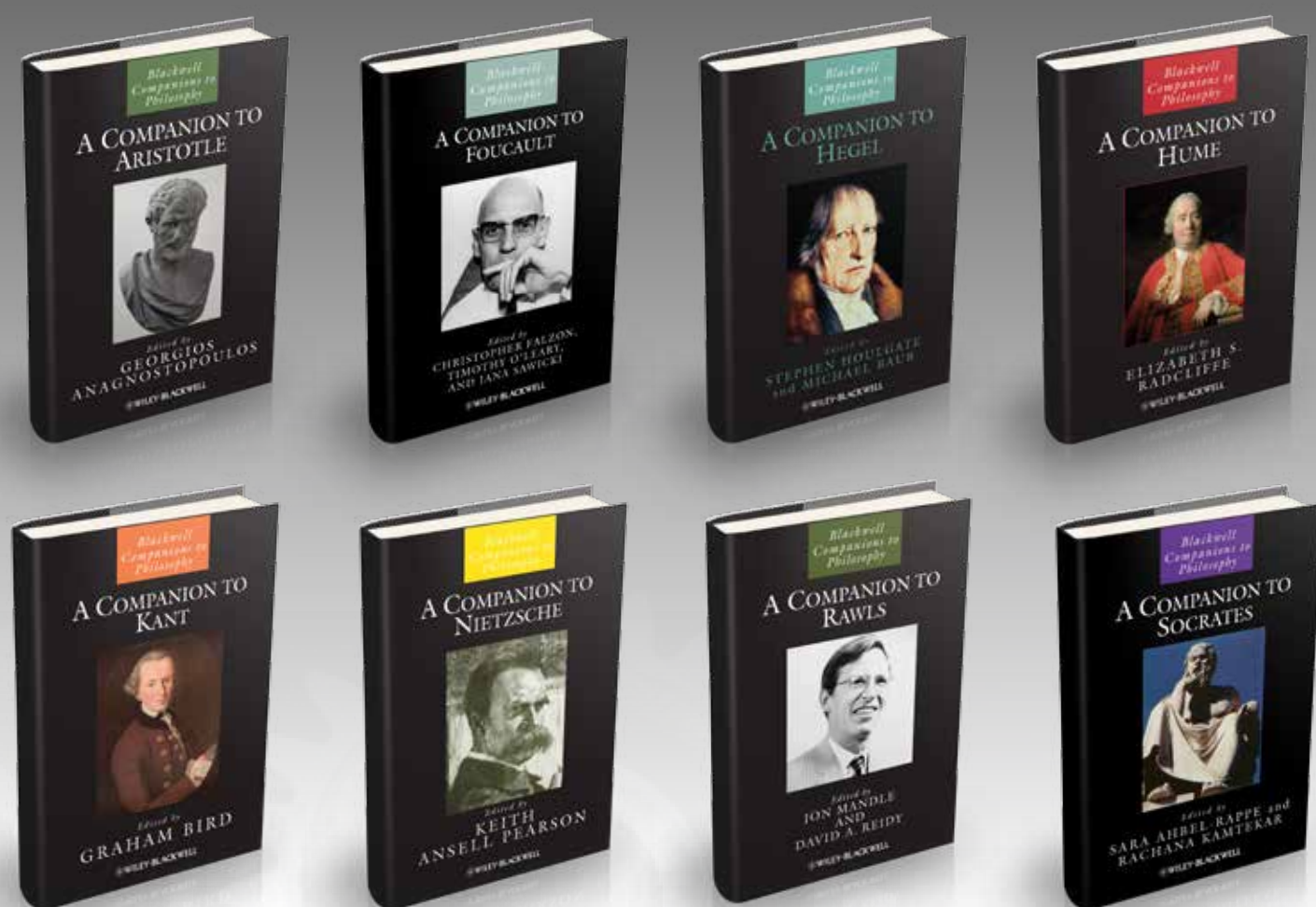
