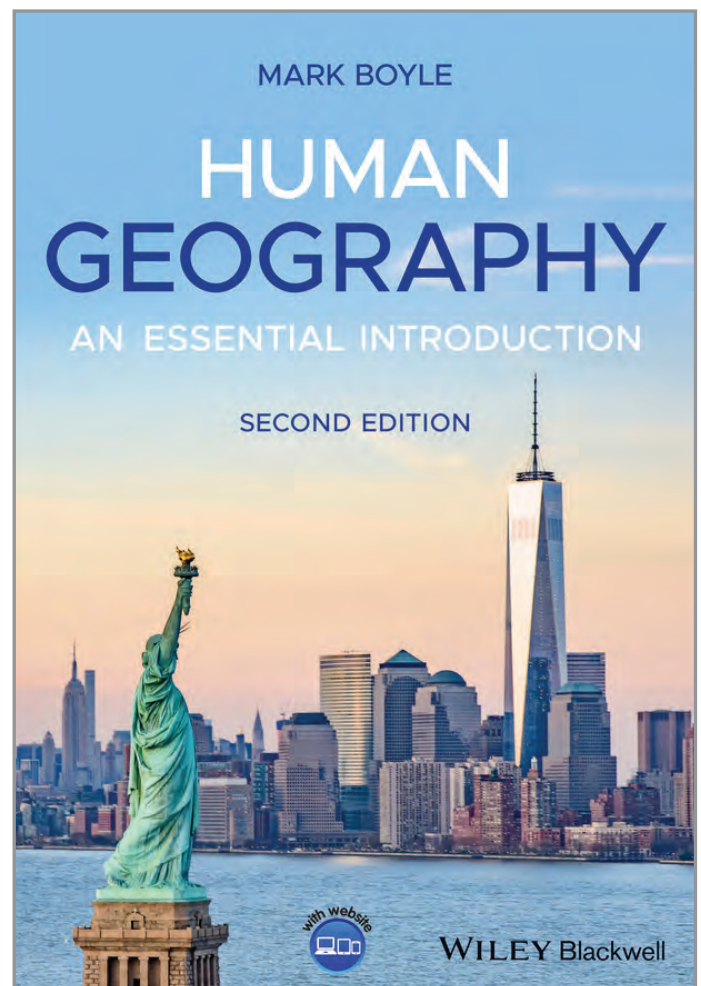

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Human Geography: An Essential Introduction is an excellent foundational text for undergraduate courses in human geography, globalization, urban studies, regional studies, and wider social science programs.

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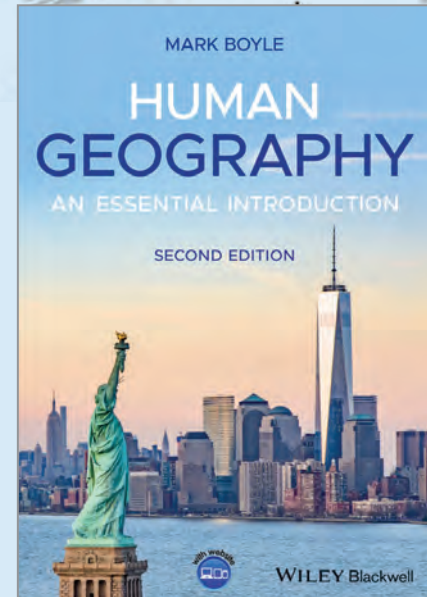
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
