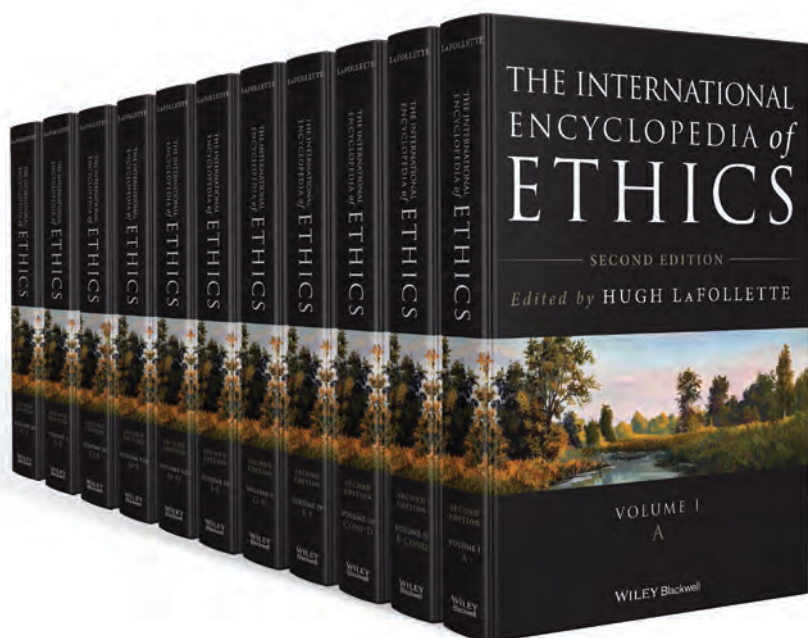


# 倫理學國際百科全書 第2版 | 11卷集

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《倫理學國際百科全書》擁有無其他書籍能與之匹敵的學術性及涵蓋範圍，是同類書籍中最全面且最具權威的倫理學資源。本百科全書提供線上版或共十一卷的印刷版，提供倫理學的廣闊視野，並與許多其他學科建立連結，包括醫學、技術研究、電腦科學、商業、宗教與法律。條目收錄的大小範圍不一，從較短的定義及傳記到重大主題的延伸探討都有，且均已經過編輯團隊和獨立審查委員會的盲性審查，以確保全書維持出色的平衡與準確性。

本百科全書的第二版是以既有的優點為基礎，涵蓋了規範倫理學、後設倫理學及應用倫理學的主題、行動、論點和數據，並包含超過 850 個完全交叉引用且依據 A-Z 排序的條目，以強調該領域的豐富性與多元性。此版新增了超過 300 個原始與更新的條目，加入對當代主題的介紹，包括選舉倫理學、人工智慧、道德不確定性、執法偏見、自戀、結構不正義、霸凌、生物政治學、法律道德主義和知性德行。

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
